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Rules for playing Multi-Monkey

Players move their monkey from the bottom of the grid to the bananas at the top of the grid.

Players make moves by setting out multiplication pairs using dice. Players will roll four dice each turn.

Monkeys start at the bottom.



A player rolls 6, 4, 3, and 2



The player chooses 6 and 4 to move to the green space- and says 6 times 4 equals 24



The Green Space means the player can move one more space the player chooses to move one space closer to the bananas.



Red Spaces are special. Red spaces give the player two choice, move a space or trade players with another player. The green player makes a 7 and a 4 with their roll.

They move to the red space in between and say 7 times 4 equals 28. They have two choices now. Move a space or trade places.





The green player decides to trade places with the red player and is now closer to the bananas.



Orange spaces are special. Players moving onto this space get to roll again. The green player has rolled. The green player uses the roll to make 4 times 2 using the 4 dice and the 3 dice minus the 1 dice. They say 4 times 2 equals 8 and moves onto the orange space between the 4 and the 2.



The green player rolls again. They roll 4, 3, 2 and 6. The player adds the 4 to the 3 to make 7 and then multiplies this by 2. The green player says 7 times 2 equals 14 and moves onto the bananas. The green player wins the game.



In the regular game, players cannot move onto a space that holds another player's piece.

You could play with one of these two rules instead:

Players can move onto a space of another player and move that player's piece one space.

or

Players can move onto a space of another player and move that player's piece to the bottom starting space.
